## Hong Kong students celebrate 2025 National Games and send messages of encouragement

As the city steps up as co-host of the15th National Games, QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School gets in on the action

Hong Kong has embraced its role as co-organiser of China's 2025 National Games, inspiring one school to channel the city's excitement into its own celebrations.

Students at QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School in Yuen Long have launched a series of activities to celebrate the nation's highest-level multi-sport event and show their support for the home team.

With major competitions such as track cycling, fencing and rugby sevens taking place in the city, the school's English Ambassadors have been leading the charge. They are running a range of activities designed to connect students with the Games, including the 12th National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the 9th National Special Olympic Games. Initiatives include sports-themed reading and writing workshops and interactive presentations.

"This has been an incredible opportunity to promote fitness and active lifestyles [while] deepening awareness and appreciation of the Games," one teacher shared, adding that it helped create a strong sense of unity and pride.

A focal point is a prominent display board on campus, made with materials provided by the Education Bureau. It teaches students the rules of the sports featured in the Games, from popular events like rugby to newer entries like sport climbing. The board is also a "wall of encouragement" for students to post uplifting messages.

"As these messages of support from students reach our athletes, we hope they provide that extra burst of energy to cross the finish line. We also encourage everyone to engage with the National Games. Who knows? The athletes of the future may well be among those cheering today," said James Booth, an English teacher at the school.

Booth added that students had expressed a strong desire to see the competitions at Hong Kong's venues, including the new Kai Tak Sports Park. They were particularly drawn to events like bowling and para dance, he said.
